

A+ Recognition Scholarships Missouri Four-Year Colleges and Universities

Updated December 2024

The A+ Schools Program is funded through the State of Missouri for Missouri public community colleges and vocational/technical schools **ONLY**.

However, some 4-year colleges in Missouri offer their own A+ recognition scholarships. These scholarships are determined by the colleges themselves and may or may not be offered at any time. **CHECK WITH THE FINANCIAL AID OFFICE AT THE 4-YEAR COLLEGES AND ASK IF THEY OFFER ANY INCENTIVES FOR A+ STUDENTS.**

Webster University	\$1000	Freshman/Renewable	Awarded to first-time freshmen who have completed the requirements for the A+ Scholarship Program at the time of graduation from an A+ designated high school in the State of Missouri. This is a Webster University award. The A+ Scholarship offered by the State of Missouri can only be used at Missouri public community colleges.	Webster Univ A+

Ranken Technical College	Varies/Renewable	Scholarships can vary from student to student based on your financial status, and on other financial assistance that the student may receive.	Ranken A+ Scholarship

Community College/4-year University Co-enrollment Programs

These programs offer students the opportunity to save on their tuition costs by using A+ to earn community college credits for the first two years, while also having a four-year college experience starting in their first year.

A+ only covers the community college tuition and fees

All other costs at the 4-year university including tuition and fees, dorms, meals, etc is the responsibility of the student to pay out of pocket or through the financial aid.

Tiger Pathways- University of MO Columbia/MACC	Use A+ funds toward MACC's tuition and fees if enrolled in 12 or more credit hours between MACC and Mizzou, with a minimum enrollment of 9 of those credit hours taken at MACC.	To be eligible, students need to have applied for freshman admission at Mizzou and have been denied. Students must have either a minimum 17 ACT Composite (920 SAT equivalent) or a 2.50 minimum high school grade point average. Students are financially responsible for the cost of tuition/fees to take 1-6 hours on Mizzou campus, living expenses (dorms if space available). May access resources on both campuses. After the first two years, transfer to Mizzou full time to complete your degree.	Tiger Pathways-Mizzou
Columbia College/MACC	Use A+ to take 12+ hours per semester through MACC on Columbia campus for the first two years.	Qualifying CC-MACC students may use A+ funds toward MACC's tuition and fees if enrolled in 12 or more credit hours between MACC and Columbia College. Students are financially responsible for the cost of tuition/fees to take 1-6 hours on Columbia College campus, living expenses (dorms if space available). May access resources on both campuses. After the first two years, transfer to Columbia College full time to complete your degree.	CC MACC
Missouri S&T Campus Connections	Use A+ for ECC tuition and fees	Qualifying students are eligible to use their A+ scholarship for ECC tuition and fees while enrolled in Campus Connections.	Missouri S&T Campus Connections

	while enrolled in Campus Connections	Students are financially responsible for the cost of tuition/fees to take 1-6 hours on Missouri S&T campus, living expenses (dorms if space available). May access resources on both campuses. After the first two years, transfer to MO S&T full time to complete your degree.	
TruMACC-Truman State University/MACC	Use A+ to take 12+ hours per semester through MACC on Kirksville campus for the first two years.	Students are financially responsible for the cost of tuition/fees to take 3-6 hours on Truman State campus, living expenses (dorms if space available). May access resources on both campuses. After the first two years, transfer to Truman State full time to complete your degree.	TruMACC Program
Missouri State University-West Plain Campus	Use A+ to cover full tuition and fees at West Plains campus for an associates degree	Graduates of A+ designated high schools can receive funds to cover the costs of tuition and common fees at participating two-year colleges and vocational programs.* Graduates certified A+ eligible by their high school can use these benefits at Missouri State-West Plains	MO St-West Plains
