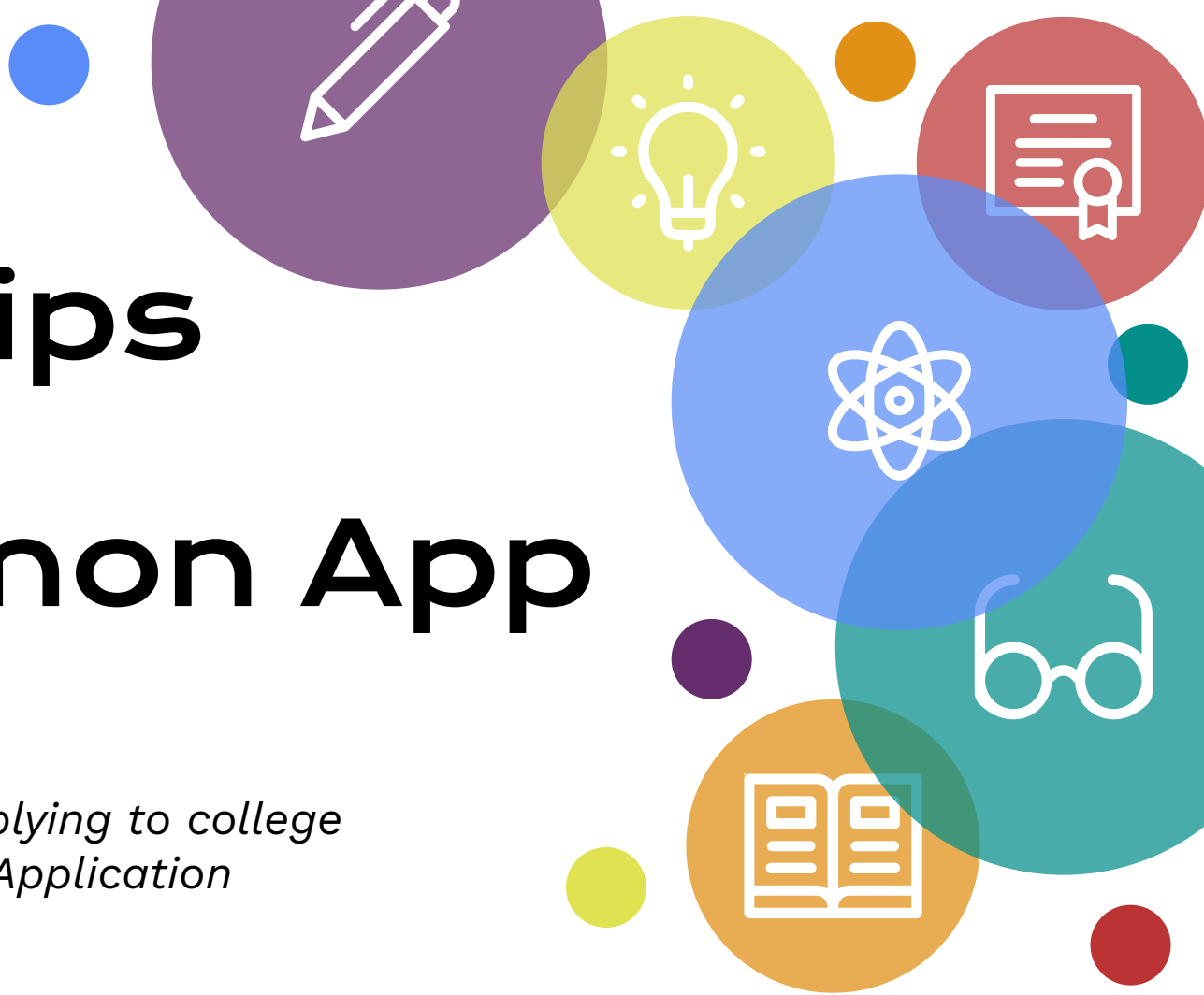

What is Common App?

If creating before August, please note...

Account rollover

The Common App launches on August 1 each year, but students don't have to wait until then.



Username and password
remain the same.



What rolls over?

- A student's college list
- Answers to questions on the Common App tab
 - Profile
 - Family
 - Education
 - Testing
 - Activities
 - Writing
 - Courses & Grades
- Advisor invitations




What does NOT roll over?

Anything on the My Colleges tab, including:

- College-specific questions
- FERPA release authorization
- Recommender invitations (counselors, teachers, other recommenders)

Information you will need when filling out the application.

Education Section	
Class Size	330
Class Rank Reporting	None
GPA Scale	4.0
Cumulative GPA	Enter directly from your transcript
GPA Weighting	Mark “ Weighted ” if you have ever taken any honors or AP classes. Otherwise, mark “Unweighted.”

Information you will need when filling out the application.

Entering Resume Items (What you are balancing on your plate?)	
Activities Section	<p>List up to 10 activities you are involved with outside of the classroom (in the order of their importance to you).</p> <p>Be sure to include commitments you have outside of PCH (employment, community/family), as well.</p>
Educational Honors & Awards	<p>List up to 5 honors related to academic achievements. This could include things like membership in honor societies or success in academic competitions (ie math, Speech/Debate, FBLA/DECA), earning your seal of biliteracy, or being named a scholar athlete.</p>

Courses & Grades Section	
Grading Scale	A-F scale
Schedule	Semesters
Semester Grades	List as indicated on your transcript (including the +/-'s) in the semester they were earned. Any “ H ” grades earned in 9th grade should be reported as “A+”. <i>**The Final Semester grade column should be left blank!</i>
Semester Credits	List all credits earned as 0.5 in the semester they were earned. <i>**The Final Semester credit column should be left blank!</i>

Essay Requirments

Common App Personal Essay

Add all colleges to your Common App Dashboard and then on the Common App tab, click on “Writing” to see if any of your colleges require the personal essay. If so, you will choose one prompt and paste your answer for submission.

*THIS IS AVAILABLE **BEFORE** AUGUST 1.

College-Specific Essays

Add all colleges to your Common App Dashboard and then click on “My Colleges” to see if school-specific short answer or essay questions are included. Those prompts could be in either the “Questions” or “Writing Supplements” sections.

*THIS IS AVAILABLE **AFTER** AUGUST 1.

Common App Personal Essay Prompt Options

If your college requires the personal essay, you will have the option to choose **one** of the following prompts:

1. Some students have a background, identity, interest, or talent that is so meaningful they believe their application would be incomplete without it. If this sounds like you, then please share your story.
2. The lessons we take from obstacles we encounter can be fundamental to later success. Recount a time when you faced a challenge, setback, or failure. How did it affect you, and what did you learn from the experience?
3. Reflect on a time when you questioned or challenged a belief or idea. What prompted your thinking? What was the outcome?
4. Reflect on something that someone has done for you that has made you happy or thankful in a surprising way. How has this gratitude affected or motivated you?
5. Discuss an accomplishment, event, or realization that sparked a period of personal growth and a new understanding of yourself or others.
6. Describe a topic, idea, or concept you find so engaging that it makes you lose all track of time. Why does it captivate you? What or who do you turn to when you want to learn more?
7. Share an essay on any topic of your choice. It can be one you've already written, one that responds to a different prompt, or one of your own design.

Recommendation Letters

Teacher Recommendation(s)

- Verify requirements for each college
 - Some accept **ZERO**, others might take 1-3
- Use core teachers
 - Eng, Math, Sci, SS, WL
- Request at least 2-3 weeks before your earliest deadline
- Provide reminders (some will upload just prior to deadlines)
- Show appreciation for their help

Counselor Forms/Recommendation

- **ALL** colleges in Common App require a School Report
- If a **counselor** recommendation letter is also required or desired, you must initiate this request with either Mrs. Prange, Dr. Flagg, Ms. Lange, Mr. Hussmann or Mrs. Greenwood.
- The counselor may ask you to complete a survey before they write.
- Show appreciation for their help
