Information about the Program:

Majors in Acting, Musical Theatre, Theatre Design and Technology or Directing/Playwriting and Production (DPP). Studies in stage combat are also available. It is a rigorous, conservatory approach. Training in voice, movement, dance, speech, improvisation, mask, combat, music, mime, stage management, theatre management, directing, history and literature support work done in the acting studio, the heart of the curriculum. Students are exposed to the Meisner technique as well as a variety of methods and approaches to acting. One semester of stage combat is required. 10-12 main stage and studio productions per year. DPP will prepare students for collaborative careers in directing, stage management, dramaturgy, arts and theatre management. Design/Tech will focus on set, lighting, costume, and sound design. Facilities include classrooms for acting studio and stage combat. Large dance studios and music facilities are also used by theatre students. Performance spaces include: Black Box Studio Theatre; Merriam Theatre with 1668 seats; a studio theater: an exciting, flexible space with seating for 50-100; The Arts Bank: 239 seat, state of the art theater and rehearsal hall.

Scholarships:

Merit Scholarships are awarded to new students who give evidence of outstanding academic and artistic ability. The awards range in amount from \$6,000-\$17,000 for 4 years. Priority deadline is March 15. In addition, students are eligible for federal, state, and university financial aid.

Information about the Program:

CAP21 is dedicated to the creation of versatile actors with the ability to work in many different facets of the entertainment industry from Broadway to film and television. CAP21 accomplishes this by providing students with integrated training that gives equal focus to acting, singing, dance, and voice and speech. CAP21's goal has always been to remain connected to our alumni and to get them working as soon as possible for as long as possible. Graduates are invited to participate in the Musical Theatre Industry Practicum and Showcase. This program is an additional semester designed to help students forge relationships with NYC casting directors and agents through master classes and mock auditions.

Scholarships:

Cap 21 offers need-based/work study scholarships. Students applying for financial assistance must complete a separate scholarship application and provide CAP21 with a copy of their most recent 1040 tax forms, a scholarship essay, and two additional letters of recommendation. These funds are limited and are first come, first served. In exchange for scholarship dollars, students will be assigned a work study job that does not interfere with their training.

Information about the Program:

The University of Cincinnati, College-Conservatory of Music offers professional, intensive, conservatory-style training in three distinct BFA programs: Drama, Musical theatre, and Theatre Design and Production. Students train with a faculty of active professionals in an arts complex that is one of the newest and thoroughly equipped in the U.S. Performance seniors showcase each spring in NYC or LA, while design and productions students have a wide variety of internship possibilities. The division produces a mixture of works each season ranging from the classics, to new works, to the avant-garde.

Scholarships:

UC offers a limited number of talent-based awards to entering undergraduates. These grants generally range from three-quarter tuition to one-quarter tuition. Few, if any full tuition waivers are available. Any student who completes an application to CCM and participates at an approved audition/interview location is immediately eligible for scholarship consideration. Scholarships are awarded for one academic year and students may request consideration for renewal. UC also offers academically based scholarships via its Cincinnati Scholarship Competition, which is by invitation only, along with others.

Information about the Program:

The Theatre School at DePaul University is one of the nation's oldest and most respected theatre conservatories. A foundation of Chicago's world-class theatre community, The Theatre School produces more than 35 productions each academic year. With highly specialized programs, The Theatre School employs a learning-by-doing approach to training, featuring student work in all areas of production. Our diverse and talented faculty of working professionals and our award-winning alumni work worldwide in theatre film, television, and related fields. In fall 2013, The Theatre School will open a new state-of-the-art five story facility including two new theatre spaces.

Scholarships:

Applicants who apply and audition/interview are automatically considered for both talent and academic scholarships which range from \$5,000 to \$15000 per year and are renewable for up to four years, Academic scholarships require a minimum 3.5 GPA and either an ACT of 27 or higher or SAT score of 1830 or higher. Returning students can be awarded additional departmental merit scholarships ranging from \$3,000 to \$10,000 per year.

Information about the Program:

Drury University is a four year undergraduate program with an emphasis on excellence and a pre-professional approach to the teaching of theatre within a liberal arts context. We have a strong, multi-faceted faculty with professional backgrounds and a low student/faculty ration. The Theatre Department is an ideal size, large enough to offer quality productions and a substantial opportunity to participate, not only in class and class projects, but in departmental productions. Freshmen become quickly active in areas of stage management and production design and technology. We provide numerous performance, technical, and design opportunities, including five main stage shows per year, performance touring programs, Student-Directed one-acts, and original skits.

Scholarships:

The Theatre Grants for incoming students are \$2,100, plus an additional \$700 for Theatre minors (minors then receiving a total of \$2,800) or an additional \$1,400 for Theatre majors (majors receiving a total of \$3,500). These grants can also be combined with other scholarship or grant monies received from other departments at Drury. The theatre grant becomes part of your package of financial aid. The grants are automatically each year and, if a student has worked significantly beyond expectations, the student may be offered the opportunity to increase the grant for the next year.

Information about the Program:

As a department of theater within a liberal arts and science university, the program allows students to gain the broad base of knowledge they need as theatre artists. Students also receive extensive, individualized theater training through classroom and production experiences. The season includes four productions performed in a 482-seat thrust theatre and two in a black box studio theatre. Each semester, a classroom project is mounted to enhance the actor/director process. The first year class is limited to 40 students because we believe our program's success is due to the small size of the department as well as the university. We have found this selective recruitment provides us with an exceptional group of creative young people with serious attitudes toward education and theatre.

Scholarships:

All students accepted to the University of Evansville, Department of Theatre receive scholarships ranging from \$5,000 to \$21,000, based on academic achievement and talent. Additional scholarships may be available depending on the student's financial need. Scholarships may be renewed each academic year for four years upon recommendation by the faculty and the continuation of satisfactory academic progress.

Information about the Program:

Fairleigh Dickinson University's BA in Theater Arts features practical learning experiences, international theatre studies abroad and the opportunity to study with accomplished faculty and theatre professionals. New York City is only 35 miles from the college at the Florham campus, an invaluable asset to Theater students. Theater majors are required to study abroad for a semester at FDU's Wroxton College in England. Theater students also have an opportunity to work closely with the Playwright's Theater of New Jersey, a professional theater company in residency on our Florham campus. With class sizes of 12-15 students and a 12:1 student to faculty ratio, Theater students receive a very personalized learning experience.

Scholarships:

Theater scholarships are renewable each year. Students who file a complete FDU application for admission and complete the required audition or interview are automatically considered for a theater scholarship, which ranges up to \$5,000 and is renewable each year.

The Department of Theatre and Dance at Gustavus Adolphus College broadly educates future theatre and dance artists and educators. The department also provides artistic experiences to the wider Gustavus community. The Hartt School Theatre Division prides itself on its commitment to offering an actor training or musical theatre education of the highest quality for talented undergraduates pursuing a performance-oriented theatre experience. The division does not employ a particular acting method; throughout the four years of study students will find what works best for them through the exploration of the various schools of acting. Actor training students present ten plays annually, ranging from classic to contemporary. Part of Junior year is spent in England, studying Shakespeare in depth. Seniors have the opportunity to participate in activities with Hartford Stage. Music theatre students take 4 years of acting, 4 years of private voice lessons with a member of our music theatre voice faculty, and the equivalent of 6 years of dance, 2 years each of ballet, tap, and jazz. Seniors have the opportunity to participate in the development of new works at Goodspeed Musicals.

Scholarships:

All students are considered for Performing Arts Scholarships, which are based primarily on the audition, secondarily on GPA/test scores. Scholarships are awarded upon acceptance and are renewable for the length of the program. Scholarships range from \$7,000 to full tuition; 86% of incoming freshman receive scholarships.

LSU's Department of Theatre offers Ph.D., M.F.A., and B.A. degrees; creating a community of artists and scholars. In addition to a world-class faculty, LSU Theatre boasts newly renovated facilities in the Music and Dramatic Arts Building which includes state-of-the-art classrooms, lab spaces and venues including the Shaver Theatre, a traditional proscenium house and the Studio Theatre, a flexible black box space. Scholarships:

The Theatre Arts Scholarship may be packaged with other scholarship awards and financial aid.

Evaluation is based on a combination of demonstrated talent, academic standing and leadership ability. The Audition: 2 minutes in length. The Portfolio Presentation: for students interested in design and technical theatre. The Interview: consists of a brief discussion with a Theatre Arts Scholarship Committee Member.
