Parkway School District Visual Arts Curriculum

First Grade -

Elementary art education develops perceptual awareness, visual literacy, creative problem solving, and higher order thinking skills. Barretts students have art classes once every four days for 55 minutes, with a visual arts specialist. School, Regional and All-District art shows provide opportunities for students to display their work.

First Grade students will:

- identify and name different types of line and use line to create shapes, forms, and patterns
- identify and mix primary and secondary colors and recognize warm and cool colors
- begin to use shading in artwork
- identify and use basic geometric and organic shapes, repeat shapes to create patterns, and organize them into a pictorial composition
- gain experience in creating 2-D and 3-D art
- recognize, understand and use a variety of textures
- identify and create foreground and background using size relationships
- identify and create a center of interest in artwork and begin to use concepts of balance in compositions
- use a variety of basic materials, media, techniques, and processes
- continue to develop fine motor skills, learn to handle all tools and materials safely, and begin to recognize good craftsmanship
- understand and follow a series of directions
- continue to make simple choices that help communicate ideas
- begin to understand that cultures have different styles and recognize distinctive characteristics of the artwork
- recognize historical differences in visual examples
- begin to recognize connections between the visual arts and other subject areas
- describe artwork and identify media using art vocabulary
- describe emotional responses to artwork.
- begin to develop the ability to discuss the quality of artwork
- begin to identify and classify basic types of artwork and media
