STUDENT CLUBS, PERFORMING GROUPS, & SPORTS

Participating in clubs, sports, and organizations after school is a way to meet new friends, develop talents, and learn leadership skills. Students are encouraged to join one or more of the variety of clubs at Parkway South. Many activities have a long tradition, while others have been formed more recently to meet the students' needs and interests.

CLUBS:

AMERICAN FOREIGN SERVICE INTERCULTURAL PROGRAM (AFS) (Dr. Diggs, Room 2414) AFS members enjoy school trips, support global education, host yearlong students and short-term exchange students.

AMNESTY INTERNATIONAL CLUB (Nicole Daniels, Room 1543) Members focus on human rights issues around the world. The South High club has decided to work this year on learning as much as possible about countries where human rights are suffering the greatest such as the Congo and the Sudan. They write letters of concern on issues screened in advance (formal letters only). They offer speakers who have information or have experienced issues in other countries.

ART CLUB (Tracy Parkhurst, Room 1222) The Art Club is for any student that is interested in art, willing to work on painting projects around the school and learning how to professionally present artwork. The club in the past has painted in the outdoor concession stand and the library. This art club is a service club and a club for the serious artist who needs time and direction for their work. Meetings are held on Wednesdays.

BEST BUDDIES (Shannon Jacob/Debbie Kreienkamp, Room 2417) Establish diversity through opportunities for one to one friendships, and leadership development for people with intellectual and developmental disabilities. Meetings are held on the 4th Wednesday of each month.

BETA CHI PI (Kathy Scheff, Room 3703) Beta Chi Pi is a nationally recognized Science Honor Society. Membership is determined by outstanding academic achievement in science coursework and individual research. Beta Chi Pi accepts membership applications during early September and mid February.

BE THE CHANGE (Monica Dickens/Ashley Winslow, Room 1503/1506) A club designed with the intention of spreading empathy and inclusivity, and to initiate change in South High. Meetings will be held twice monthly.

BOOK CLUB (Becky Neil, Library) Do you enjoy reading? Do you like to discuss with others what you've read? This club is for students to get together, read a book of their choosing and discuss its content. For more information please contact Becky Neil in the library.

FUTURE BUSINESS LEADERS OF AMERICA (FBLA) (Greg Schuermeyer, Room 2516) FBLA is an opportunity for members to develop vocational and career competency in the business field as well as promote civic and personal responsibilities.

FUTURE EDUCATORS OF AMERICA (FEA) (Monica Dickens, Room 1506) Future Educators of America prepares high school students to be future teachers. The club meets on Tuesdays.

FUTURE PHYSICIANS OF AMERICA (Chris Orban, Room 2401) This club talks about niche physician fields, and what they do, how they do it and what doctors do behind the scenes. They meet every other Monday.

GAMING CLUB (Lawrence Merrill, Room 2503) A community for people who like video games to come together and have fun. This club meets every Wednesday in the library classroom.

GENDER/SEXUALITY ALLIANCE (GSA) (Lisa Giljum, Room 2410) Our purpose is to create a safe space for LGBTQ+ students as well as promote acceptance and celebration through education and peaceful activism. This club meets every other Wednesday.

GERMAN CLUB (Rick Wickham, Room 2207) Our club meetings promote interest in German culture, provide opportunities to practice using the language, and help students build friendships and leadership skills. Meetings are held one day a week after school.

GIRLS IN ENGINEERING (Brian Oakley, Room 1528) This is a club that focuses on getting female students at South High interested in technology and engineering.

GOOD EATS CLUB (Jennifer Sommer, Room 2212) To spread the word about healthy eating and animal cruelty. We plan to meet once a month on Thursdays.

INTERNATIONAL THESPIAN SOCIETY (Jennifer Forrest-James, Room 1101) The International Thespian Society (ITS) is the serious drama student's honorary society where students can further their commitment to the art form. ITS attends productions of other troupes and socials with other ITS troupes, as well as attending the state and national conventions. Meetings are held after Drama Club meetings.

JAPANESE CLUB (Aaron Cook, Room 2200) Japanese club explores all things Japan. It meets on Wednesday after school. Any interested students are welcome to attend.

KEY CLUB (Mick Hachmeister/Sarah Sehie, Room 2217) An international community service organization built around the concept of caring. We help with the Special Olympics Basketball Tournament, collect donations for a women's shelter, collect books for Children's Hospital and help with several other service projects which can include canned food drives, teddy bear drives, Hugs for Kids (blankets to hospitals), and making sandwiches for food pantries.

KNITTING CLUB (Julie Barnes, Room 2008) If you enjoy knitting or would like to learn how to knit, this club is for you!

LATIN CLUB (Jason Tiearney, Room 2213) The Latin Club's main purpose is spreading awareness of Latin to those who don't really know about it and further enhance those who already study it. They have plans for field trips, school-sponsored activities, and Latin-themed games. There will also be opportunities for tutoring. They will meet twice a month in Room 2213.

MATH CLUB (Mu Alpha Theta) (Scott Degitz/Allison McDonald, Room 1710) Math Club focuses on problem solving techniques, competing in both after school and weekend math competitions. Students compete in the Great Plains Math League at the local, state, and regional level, and compete in the Missouri Math League, Atlantic-Pacific Math League, and Mandelbrot Math League after school contests. Meetings are held every other week, all year long. All students are welcome.

MEDICAL SCIENCE/CLUB HOSA (Todd Yeager, Room 3416) To inform and prepare those interested in going into the medical field and to get more people interested in joining the medical field.

MINUTEMAN HONOR GUARD (Vic Fulgham) In keeping with our school mascot the Patriot Honor Guard is a group of 6 to 10 highly motivated South High Patriots that present the U.S. flag at school functions, games, and parades. They wear the uniforms of Minutemen, and women of our Revolutionary War period 1775-1783. Membership in the Honor Guard is open to all South High students that want to show their "Patriot Pride".

MUSIC APPRECIATION CLUB (Drew Jennings, Room 2307) To meet and host the Battle of the Bands.

MUSLIM STUDENT ASSOCIATION (MSA) (Rodney Holtmeyer, Room 104) This club is for students to be educated on Islam and can openly discuss current issues.

NATIONAL ART HONOR SOCIETY (Eric Ludlow, Room 1233) This club is for art students that have been recommended based on art scholarship, service, and character. The students participate in service projects for the school and the community. Students also take field trips to artist's studios, galleries and exhibits.

NATIONAL SPEECH AND DEBATE ASSOC (Michael Hachmeister/Pete Wissinger, Room 2217) Members compete with actors, debaters and speakers from other schools; however, the focus centers on performance skills and the thrill of participation. Participation is open to all eligible through MSHSAA guidelines and membership in the national honorary is earned through tournament participation. Practices are held after school through appointments with the coaches; students may choose to begin to compete at any time during the fall or early winter.

NATIONAL HONOR SOCIETY (Robert Lappin, Counseling) A faculty selection committee chooses NHS members who demonstrate outstanding scholarship, leadership, character, and service. Students are inducted in the second semester of their Sophomore or Junior years only.

NEWSPAPER (Gavin Brady, Room 1537) South's number one publication, *The Treaty*, is created and published by students who have an interest and aptitude in writing, photography, art, and business. Students publish their work on the online newspaper, www.psouthtreaty.com. See your counselor to sign up for this class.

OUTDOOR ADVENTURE CLUB (Dave Richardson, Room 3701) This club is designed to provide students with like interests to get together and engage in outdoor activities that include canoeing, camping, caving, biking, climbing, hiking, paintball, rafting, etc.

PATRIOT FITNESS CLUB (TBD, Weight Room) The purpose of this club is simply to promote fitness and help bring structure to people who would not otherwise work out. This club meets every day in the Weight Room after school.

PATRIOT RENAISSANCE (Jen Sebold/Jenny Nelson, Student Activities) Patriot Renaissance is a student organization that works to acknowledge the educational achievements, outstanding contributions, and citizenship of students and staff members through a process of recognition, reinforcement and reward.

PEER TEACHING (Dave McFarland, Katie Pendleton) This program is a Parkway School District prevention program. High school Junior and Senior students are trained to introduce topics about decision making and self-esteem to seventh grade classrooms. The peer teachers present the program at Southwest Middle School or South Middle School.

POETRY CLUB (Melissa Gebhard/Steve Wissinger, Room 2408) Members read, write and share poetry of all kinds. Meetings are held after school on the first and third Tuesday of the month. Love writing and desire to become a part of a fine school tradition are a must.

POKEMON TABLETOP UNITED (Steffani Guzman, Room 2312) Pokemon role playing increases creativity while bringing together Pokemon fanatics.

ROBOTICS TEAM (CG Coulson, Room 1542) The robotics club competes in the national FIRST robotics competition, designing a robot for that year's major game. The robot must be constructed from prescribed parts, much like the MIT Engineering competition. In addition, students compete in designing their website and the 3D visualization and animation competitions. All students are welcome to participate. Contact Mr. Morrison for meeting times.

ROOTS AND SHOOTS CLUB (Julie Jauss, Room 3706) Do you want to make a difference in the world around you? Join Patriot's Roots and Shoots club, part of Jane Goodall's worldwide group to help people, animals, and the environment. We meet every other Monday in Mrs. Jauss's room (3706). Come and join us for fun activities and projects that will make a difference.

SCHOLAR BOWL (Academic Team) (Scott Degitz/Allison McDonald, Room 1710) Quiz Bowl students will compete in contests that emphasize all areas of trivia. Anyone who enjoys Jeopardy or Trivial Pursuit would love Quiz Bowl! Open to all grades and all levels of experience and knowledge. Meetings will be held on Tuesdays after school.

SCIENCE OLYMPIAD (Susan Scott, Room 3404) This club is for students interested in exploring the world of science and participating in Science Olympiad tournaments. They will meet once a month.

SIXTH GRADE OUTDOOR SCHOOL COUNSELOR (Counseling office) South students recommended by the faculty serve as counselors for sixth graders at a weeklong camp experience.

SKI/SNOWBOARDING CLUB (Kathy Scheff, Room 3703) This club will meet on once a week or once every two weeks to ski and snowboard at Hidden Valley Ski Resort from December through February.

SUPERINTENDENT'S LEADERSHIP ADVISORY COUNCIL (SLAC) (Darryl Diggs, Room 2414) An organization of leadership council members from the Parkway South student body

representing racial/cultural diversity, academic class, and gender. This group meets monthly with the Superintendent to discuss issues that impact student life in the Parkway School.

TVC-TEEN VOICE FOR CHANGE (Katie Pendleton, Library) Teen Voice for Change is a teen-led club that focuses on community service projects and alcohol and drug abuse prevention.

THEATRE DEPT (Jennifer Forrest-James, Room 1543) Theatre club is for any student interested in theatre and production. Meetings are the first Thursday of each month.

WORLD HEALTH ORGANIZATION CLUB (WHOC) (Chloe Gallaher, Room 3406) Learn and evaluate medical issues and activities in the WHO and HOW it impacts us and what we can do.

YOUTH AND GOVERNMENT (Steff Guzman, Room 2312) State government simulation sponsored by the YMCA. Students travel to Jefferson City in December and participate in running Mock Missouri Government.

PERFORMING GROUPS:

BELLA VOCE and VOICE MALE (Connor Scott) Groups are open by audition to all grade levels for students that are currently enrolled in a choir class. Groups perform two major concerts each school year and may perform in an all A Cappella concert in the Spring semester. The groups meet at 6:45am throughout the school year.

FRESHMAN TREBLE CHOIR (Connor Scott) Open to all Freshman treble voices. Students perform in four major concerts each school year.

CONCERT CHOIR TREBLE (Connor Scott) Open to all Sophomores, Juniors and Seniors treble voices. Students perform in four major concerts each school year.

CONCERT CHOIR (Connor Scott) Freshman through Senior treble/bass voices, Junior and Senior treble voices, and exceptional Sophomore treble voices by audition. Students perform in five major concerts each school year.

ADVANCED CHAMBER CHOIR (Connor Scott) Exceptional Freshman through Senior tenor/bass voices and Sophomore through Senior treble voices based on audition. Juniors and Seniors may take the course for Honors option.

COLOR GUARD (Chrissy Schuler/John Barnes) Students selected by audition, who perform choreographed flag and rifle routines at performances and competitions with the band during marching season..

JAZZ BAND (John Barnes) Members selected from Marching Band by audition (some exceptions permitted) and perform at various events and concerts.

ORCHESTRA (Ed Simon) Membership is earned by participation in the orchestra, supporting the program through special performances and projects. Previous experience on an orchestral instrument is required and possible audition placement for top ensembles.
