You will be able to access when your student has positive and needs work points earned. I also can collect the data in a week, month and trimester to help me mark report cards.

All students need to get up to 10 points in order to earn a Friday Movie. This is a 20 minute period of time for students to watch movies such as musicals such as Newsies or Mary Poppins, Magic School Bus or Planet Earth. Students do not make 10 points will have to sit out and work on extra independent work and/or read from their book box.

Seating

I have flexible seating in my classroom. What this means is that there are different types of seating available to the child throughout the day. The kids will start at a desk, "Home desk," their name plate, and supplies will be housed here. However every time we have a subject change, about every hour, the kids can choose what type of seat they learn or respond to best.

Types of seats: stools, ball chairs, blue chairs, standing, or sitting.

If they choose a seat that ends up not being a good choice I may move them, just for that hour.
